## The **budget for housing recovery** from Harvey has **continued to grow** with additional appropriations from Congress

### OVERVIEW

- After Harvey, Congress appropriate funds to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for long-term recovery from the storm, in September 2017
- HUD allocated these funds to the State of Texas General Land Office (GLO) in February 2018. GLO issued large sub-grants to the City of Houston and Harris County to administer local recovery efforts in December 2018
- Houston's initial sub-grant has grown with additional appropriations, from just over \$1 billion, to \$1.27 billion
- The City's plan to spend recovery dollars is outlined in the State of Texas' Action Plan for Hurricane Harvey Recovery
- This document is updated periodically through an amendment process. All amendments must be approved by HUD
- The City held 18 public meetings in May and June 2018 to get input on budgets and programs

### BUDGET

Pending approval from HUD, the budget for housing recovery from Harvey in the City of Houston will be:
